Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels delivers hot meals to homebound seniors throughout Hawaii. The service also provides ready-to-heat lunches and dinners for holidays and weekends. Volunteers provide welfare checks and offer companionship services. Most services provide two meals daily for those who cannot purchase or prepare meals on their own.
